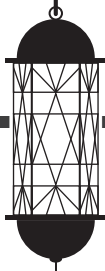

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Brotherly Love

V'Dibartah Bam

(Speaking in Torah)

IN THIS WEEK'S PARSHA, THE TORAH TELLS US THE story of the strife between Yosef and his brothers. Several events cause the tension to build; Yosef informs on his brothers; Yaakov gives Yosef a special, colorful coat; and Yosef shares his dreams of his brothers bowing to him.

Amid this contentious climate, Yaakov gives Yosef a rather unusual mission.

He said to him, "Go now, look into the *shalom* (welfare) of your brothers..." (Bereishis 37:14)

Indeed, this instruction is what led Yosef to fall prey to his brother's ambush and wind up left for dead in a pit full of snakes and scorpions. What was Yaakov thinking? Didn't he realize that this would be a precarious endeavor for Yosef?

Rav Bunim mi'Peshischa offers a fantastic *p'shat* in this *pasuk*. He explains that when Yaakov told Yosef "Go now, look into the *shalom* of your brothers," he was telling Yosef to go look for their *shleimus*, their wholeness and completeness—to view them in a positive light and search for their better qualities. Yaakov had perhaps just heard Yosef share a negative report about his brothers. Now Yaakov instructed his son Yosef to reverse the process by specifically looking for good things about them.

Ahavas Yisroel is a great mitzvah and, like all other mitzvos, it demands hard work; it doesn't happen on its own. Going out of our way to see the good in each other is a powerful way to accomplish this goal.

Just this week, someone called Rav Shalom Kamenetsky, *shlit"a*, with a question regarding a child who was struggling. The conversation was brief and to the point, with the knowledge and clarity unique to a *talmid chacham* of his great stature.

As the caller began to say his thank-you's and good-bye's, Rav Shalom interrupted with a question: "What's the child's name?"

After a short pause, Rav Shalom explained, "I would like to *daven* for the child." So simple, so small, and yet so profound! *Ahavas Yisroel* is within reach: A thoughtful touch and looking for the positive in each other. May we be *zochim* to replace the *sin'as chinam* of the past with *ahavas Yisroel* of the present, and bring Moshiach *b'mheira b'yameinu—amen!*
